
Urgent Timing and Funding Strategy

Target Dining Hall construction for the 2023 camp season. The following strategy is being pursued.

- Raise half of the \$1.2M by June 2022 through the All-Hands-In \$400K effort, adding to the existing \$200K already raised.
- Gain monthly commitments to support a bank loan for the remaining funding.

Who We Are - Christian Outreach Camp

For 52 years, Northwestern Ohio Christian Youth Camp has been a "SAFE HOUSE" for souls seeking to meet or grow closer to the Father, find belonging, practice independence, and create Christian relationships.

The camp is governed by a Board of Directors representing Churches of Christ primarily throughout Northwest Ohio.

What We Do - Create Godly Connections

NWOCYC currently serves approximately 400 campers with 200 staff over 5 to 6 camp weeks per summer.

These weeks are led by volunteers including, a director, cabin counselors, nurses, cooks, handy-men, and teachers.

Activities each week include daily Bible lessons, multiple daily devotionals, singing, planned group activities, exercise, recreation, and congregate meals.



Why a New Dining Hall - Immediate Need

- The current Dining Hall was built in the 1940's and is deteriorating despite maintenance efforts.
- Safety: Basement. To have a place below ground for all campers and staff to gather during inclement weather.
- Expanding months of usage. A new dining hall with modern HVAC allows for use year-round, expanding our outreach capabilities.
- Health Regulations. Maintaining the kitchen facilities to keep in compliance with all rules and regulations continues to be challenging and costly.
- Kitchen Facilities. We need a commercial kitchen to better provide meals for our many campers and staff.
- Kitchen infrastructure and equipment need replaced. Current equipment is outdated.
- Multi-purpose building. The dining area, basement, and large porch will provide many opportunities for meals, fellowship, Bible study, and special events.

Building Plans

The camp Board has pursued a modest building, while assuring a modern, quality construction. The necessary funding amounts to \$1,200,000, the largest investment ever in the history of our beloved camp.

- 6000sqft Year-round facility will have central heat and air conditioning
- Accommodate dining for 200 people
- · Kitchen and Restrooms
- Basement for shelter, canteen and game area
- Wood framing with metal siding and roof (best value materials)
